Kindness Meals

As a response to COVID-19, the Euclid South CID donated to the Kindness Meals Program. The Kindness Meals Program is a platform that helps residents and the corporate community partner to help small businesses and front-line responders. The program purchases meals from impacted small businesses and donated them to frontline-workers.

The Euclid Shuffle

the Euclid Shuffle is a five-passenger cab that provides free transportation within the surrounding area to help community members and visitors get around during their Euclid excursions.

Beautification, Safety, and Other Improvements

Efforts are continually underway in the South Euclid CID to maintain and develop the quality of the area. Beautification of the area is promoted through street sweeping, litter control, tree pruning, weed control, and maintenance of flower displays and light post bulbs.

Safety in the area is enforced by investing in approx. 1000 hours in police patrol and 820 hours of guide patrol.

Other improvements to the area include streetscape improvements and new developments (e.g. Hotel Indigo and 100 N Kingshighway).




